




In Picture News the team asked us to think about whether fashion was important. We thought about the television program 'Style it Out' which gives young designers a chance to compete against each other in designing fashion that is











Loving reading!

Year 2 have started to read a book called 'Little Red *Reading* Hood' in their English lessons. Little Red Reading Hood loves reading stories and making up stories of her own. The Year 2

children found some comfortable spaces in school to read some of their favourite stories together. They discovered that reading was even more fun when you share a great story with some friends.






Imaginative ideas

Year 3 have been collecting and experimenting with different sentence structures to create different effects within their narrative writing. They have been encouraged to think about the impact different word choices will have on the reader in their stories.

Encouraging each other to find the best word to create the desired effect has helped their writing to be so descriptive and imaginative. Their use of similes was impressive too. Well done, Year 3.





Designing computer games

Year 4 have discovered that they can design and make computer games that help them to develop their maths skills. They used 2Calculate (a spreadsheet program) to generate maths questions using controls such as a random number generator, a timer and a hidden number button. After creating their own games, they played each others to test them out.



We can't wait to share the musical talents we have discovered with our parents on Monday in the Spring Music Celebration Concert!

The Year 4s have also been discovering the power of personification in their writing. They have created some truly imaginative examples and it will be exciting to see them being used in their writing later this term.





How can we separate a mixture?

Year 5 have been learning about mixtures in science. They learnt about homogenous and heterogenous mixtures and worked in groups to sort different types into a table. Then they put their learning into practice. They were given a mixture of water, soil, sand and oats and had to decide which parts they thought they would be able to separate out. They were given a garden sieve to start off with, but they were encouraged to consider ways of adapting it to help to separate the mixture further. They discussed using a sieve with smaller holes and tried using some filter paper. They thought really carefully about how to solve the challenge. Well done, Year 5.



Evolution and Inheritance

Year 6 have been learning about the place of fossils in our understanding of evolution. On Friday, Nick came to school with his very large collection of fossils and the children were able to get up close and personal to dinosaur teeth, fossilised bark and even fossilised dinosaur poo! They were in awe of how old the fossils were and how much could be learned from them.























A giant ammonite!

One of the fossils that Nick brought with him was part of an ammonite. The part he brought was really big, but was actually broken and the original ammonite would have been at least three times bigger. The children looked at the part that had survived and attempted to draw the missing part to discover how big the original ammonite would have been and what it might have looked like. They used examples of smaller ammonites to help them.











Awards from home
We celebrated Lachlan's swimming skills this week. He has achieved his Stage 2 award which means his confidence in the water is growing and he is able to perform different floats and rolls. He has also been brave and taken off all floats to swim 5m by himself. He now knows he can do it and is keen to develop his swimming skills so that he can swim further and further. Bella and Sienna have discovered that they are not only good at dancing, but can tumble too. They have achieved their novice tumbling award – well done girls!



Awards in school

This week Isabelle came to share the most amazing piece of art work with me. She has been working on this piece for a long time, and has persevered to maintain the style and textures throughout. Her abstract

art work is full of depth and colour and she was rightly proud of the effect she had achieved. The children who were in my office at the time were all in awe of how fabulous the effects were showed it to us. What a talented artist!















