






They shared about how the farmers in France carried out a peaceful protest when they needed to be heard, and we reflected on the importance of making our voices heard when we see things that are unjust or to acknowledge something that we think is important.



Amazing Architects

The children in RB have been using straws and Sellotape to design different shaped shelters for their pigs. They concentrated really hard to join the straws so that they stood up strong. The children found that a pyramid shape worked really well and were so proud of their successful structures.





In maths, they have been learning about doubles and showing what they have found by writing number sentences.



















Chimney stacking

This week in RP the children have been challenged to build tall chimneys that the pigs could put on top of their houses to try to keep out the wolf. They worked in pairs to encourage each other and complete the challenge while learning more about the properties of 3D shapes. They discovered that flat faces were the most stable for building the tall chimney, and that pyramids, cones or hemispheres needed to balance on the top.



























How can we make numbers that are bigger than ten?


The children in Year 1 have been representing numbers to 20 in as many different ways they can. They were teaching others what they had found out – spotting lots of similarities between their representations.


What can our amazing




bodies do?

The tree also has buds – spring is definitely on the way!















Amazing Artists

Year 2 have begun their work to create African masks in art. They have used cardboard and other junk modelling materials to design the shape for their mask, ready to develop it further next lesson. They worked really hard to create the exact shapes and sizes of the features in their masks: eyes, mouths, noses, eyebrows, cheeks. Sewing a hem





The Year 4 children discovered that it took a lot of patience and concentration to learn how to sew a hem in fabric so that it wouldn't fray. They have definitely shown 'Don't give up' as they all achieved a hem in their work.

BT Book and Comic Club – Friday Lunchtimes

This week was the first session of the BT Book and Comic Club. When the children see a big 'B' on the Year 4 classroom they are welcome to go along to the club. The main classroom space is for quiet shared reading and the locker room is set up for individual silent reading. Mrs Rhodes really enjoyed opening her classroom up to read.



How do different climate zones affect land use?

Year 5 have been working in hard in geography lessons to consider how different climate zones in North and South America would affect the land use and type of farming that could occur there. They worked collaboratively to discuss how the different types of farming required particular conditions and where this could occur.











Dynamic Dancing

Year 6 have continued with their discovery of different dance styles through the decades. They travelled back to the 80s this week to learn some hip hop moves. The different dance steps were demonstrated by Willow, Isaac, Sienna-Mai and Bella and the children considered how these could be developed and simplified to match the abilities of different dancers. They then worked in pairs to combine the steps into a longer dance and performed their ideas to the class. The children were really encouraging of each others' successes, commenting on positive collaboration and team work as well as particular sections of dance steps that worked effectively with the music.

On Tuesday, Henry, Evan, Pippa and Edith represented the school in an archery competition at Newbold Comyn Leisure Centre. They worked really hard to develop their archery skills, and it was noticed how encouraging they were of each other and how they concentrated really hard to make great progress in the accuracy of their shooting. We are really proud of them!

This week, we have celebrated some more swimming awards. Olivia brought her Stage 2 swimming award and is growing in confidence in the water. Oscar brought his Stage 4 swimming award and can now swim 10m breaststroke, back crawl, front crawl and butterfly. Isabelle has been working on her stamina and achieved her 25m distance award. She didn't stop at 25m though, and carried on to swim 50m. Well done to all of you.



Here are some ideas we found on a google search to inspire you.














World Book Day Menu:

Children will be able to order a 'World Book Day' lunch as normal at registration on 7th March if they would like to join in the fun.






Charity Hat Parade




















Secrets of Success Champions
