

### Worship this week...

In worship this week we thought about Ramadan, and how many Muslims used this time to reflect on the previous year as well as build self-control in saying no to things that they would like. We found that many Muslims don't eat during daylight hours and spend more time praying. This helps them to realise what life is like for some people who don't have enough food too, and some Muslims give more money to charity during Ramadan. On Tuesday the Secrets of Success spotters celebrated people who had shown 'Work Hard' this week. It was a tricky task for the spotters with lots of children working hard across school!

On Wednesday the children enjoyed singing the Easter songs in preparation for our Easter service next week.











On Thursday our Picture News team helped the children to think about the question: Should mobile phones be banned in all classrooms? The children thought very carefully about the advantages and disadvantages of having their phones in lessons. Some children were allowed to play on iPads during the worship session, and while they could remember some key things that were discussed, struggled to be able to recall the details as the iPads had distracted them from listening fully.

## Architects in the making

The children in RP have also been busy building bridges linked to the story 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'. They discovered different ways to make their bridges long and strong, working together to overcome any problems (like the straws being too short) that they met along the way.

They counted how many bricks their bridges could hold to measure how strong they were. They used tape, straws, newspaper and string in their designs.





### Weatherproof materials After the wet start to 2024, we have had to think about preparing for the Spring Fair early. I have been worried about the bunting for the fair being destroyed by the rainy weather

we might have to endure, so asked Year 1 to test some different materials to see what will make the best bunting if the showery weather doesn't stop soon.























They have also been exploring how wonderful woodlands are and found lots of lovely things in our woodland areas in school: birds, ferns, lichen, brambles, birds' nests, trees and a ladybird.

















## Chocolate Crispy Cakes

Year 2 have been discovering how to make chocolate crispy cakes. After creating their own set of instructions for making the crispy cakes, it was important for them to taste the results to check that the cakes were tasty enough to share their instructions with others.

They thought of lots of different adjectives to describe the cakes they had made: sweet, crunchy, delicious, tasty, crumbly, yummy.








## What are the key characteristics of mammals?









### Awards in school

Labyrinth this week, while KS1 and EYFS winners chose Pop up pirate. We had lots of fun and enjoyed some fruit and fizzy water as we played.
















## Charity Hat Parade
