In Collective Worship this week we have continued to think about 'Achieve' from our IDEALS.



On Monday in Collective Worship we lit the first candle in advent symbolising hope and we thought about what we hope for ourselves, our families, our village and the world. We also talked about how full and busy our lives are in the run up to Christmas, and how it is important to have some time to rest in Advent too.

On Tuesday we read the story 'We're going on a bear hunt' where people went through: grass, a river, squelchy mud, a big forest and a snowstorm. At each point in the story the characters were a little bit scared and we talked about what risks there might be that might make them feel scared. On these occasions, though, the characters felt that it was fun to feel scared. This links to our Protective Behaviours work. Have you ever chosen something scary to try that was fun?







On Wednesday Reverend Jonathan told us that advent isn't just about preparing for Christmas – it is about waiting and taking time to rest so that Christian people can think about the birth of Jesus. On Thursday in Picture News worship we talked about how in

Iceland some earthquakes have been rumbling since October. These have been building up to the predicament of the volcano called Fagradalsfjall and residents are being asked to leave their homes as a stream of molten lava is reaching close to their town.
