


Christingle Workshop

Learning about shapes

In maths, the children have been learning about the properties of shapes and using them in creative ways.

They have named the shapes and used them to create pictures.

They have built their own shapes with natural materials.

They have compared different trees using mathematical vocabulary such as 'shortest' and 'tallest' as well as ordinal numbers.
