Worship Focus

This half term our IDEALS focus has been 'Discover'. We have thought about people who have discovered talents and skills.

<u>Jesus – Light of the World</u>

We started the term by lighting our Christmas Candle in the advent wreath. We talked about things that are fast, and realised that light is faster than sound. We wondered how fast Jesus could move if he is the Light of the World? We thought back to our worship about prayer last half term, and felt that sometimes He wasn't fast to answer prayers.





Julia Child


We learned about Julia Child who dreamed of being in the army or navy. She wasn't able to, but did become a spy. As a spy she created cakes to keep sharks away from underwater mines that were protecting allies from enemy submarines. From this discovery she learned that she was great at baking and went on to bake many cakes and host her own TV show. Sometimes our dreams don't work out as we imagined, but we may discover talents and skills along the way.





Old Testament Discoveries

We thought about people in the Bible who discovered talents: Joseph discovered that he could understand dreams, Moses discovered that he could convince Pharoah to release the Hebrew slaves; and David discovered he could beat a giant soldier despite never having any training. We then went on to think about Noah. He learned that he could build a boat even though he lived a long way from water. Zach discovered he could build a boat too – even though he thought it wouldn't work!





Discovery of the power of faith

Meshach, Shadrach and Abednego (three Jewish men) discovered that staying true to their faith in God could save them from death. When King Nebuchadnezzar built a statue and demanded that the people of his kingdom worship it, they refused and continued to worship their God. Their punishment for disobeying the kings orders was to be thrown in to the fire, but the King saw a fourth person in the fire with them, protecting

them from the heat. The fourth person looked like the son of God. King Nebuchadnezzar began to worship their God when he saw how he could protect the men.



Discovering the power of imagination

We began by imagining what we might do or say if King Charles walked into our school with children saying they would welcome him and maybe bow or curtsy. If Moana visited the children had lots of questions they would want to ask her. We went on to imagine a playground, then imagine Jesus waiting to meet us there. We thought about what Jesus might be doing and what we might say to him. It appears he may be good at football, and enjoy sliding and swinging too!





Discovery of the importance of rest

As we approached half term, we thought about the importance of rest. In the Creation Story in the Bible, God created the world in six days and on the seventh day he rested. This is called the Sabbath. Christian people are encouraged to take a day of rest each week. WE thought about the ways we liked to rest: playing outside, reading a good book, having a nap, listening to music. Lots of us liked to rest by playing computer games. We discovered that computer games are really good fun, but actually don't help our brain to rest – they make our brain really active. We were challenged to find a different way to rest in the hour before we go to bed, to help our brains stop and rest too.



Picture News Worship

This half term, our Picture News team have changed the way they plan worship sessions, and we meet together as KS1 or KS2 now. They plan their worship carefully with Mr Bench, then present the question of the week to the children. Many children have shared that it is their favourite worship of the week!

Reverend Jonathan has visited school to lead worship with us and has encouraged us to think deeply about the Magi and Candlemas as well as using some Mr Men in his worship times.






What have the children been learning?

This half term saw the children living out so many of our IDEALS in school. Each week we counted the raffle tickets and the leading team changed often through the half term.








We would like to say a huge well done to Blue Team, who collected the most raffle tickets and will celebrate with a 'Wear What you Want' day on Tuesday 25th February.

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

In school we use emotion coaching to support pupils to understand their emotions and find strategies to manage their behaviour choices when they are finding things tricky.

Teaching children to recognise, accept and understand their emotions (including big emotions) can lead to them finding strategies to help when they experience these emotions.

Using emotion coaching strategies at home will support the work we are doing in school.
